Writers in the Schools (WITS) is a program funded by Seattle Arts and Lectures that, if funded, by Highline Schools Foundation, would bring poet, performer, playwright and teaching artist Daemond Arrindell to our classroom at New Start. Others that would be involved would, of course, be me, who will work in collaboration with Daemond and all of my Language Arts Students. My students, their parents and/or guardians, families as well as my principal, Mike Sita would also be involved because they would be invited to Benaroya Hall to celebrate student's work in September of 2020.

OVERALL PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Students will be inspired to write a creative piece of poetry, prose or even a comic and, if selected, the student will be able to perform their original work at Benaroya Hall in Seattle in September of 2020. The student work also has the chance to be published in an anthology written by K-12 students from all students who participate in the WITS program which is sponsored by Seattle Arts and Lectures.

WHAT MAKES THIS PROJECT INNOVATIVE OR ESSENTIAL?

This project is innovative and essential to our students at New Start because it will give our students the opportunity to share their stories and lift their voices in a variety of creative ways. The mission of Writer's in the Schools is based on the belief that "every student has a story that needs to be heard and that we, as a society becomes stronger through sharing our stories." (WITS Values Statement: Speaking Truth) The creative piece that student's design with the help of a teaching artist, if selected, could be published in a book that students could keep for their entire lifetime. By having the opportunity to share their work aloud, at Benaroya Hall, in a grand setting, will empower them. Finally, the possible experience of a book signing, where their stories are not only heard, but recognized and honored is POWERFUL.
